GENESIS 22-26: ABRAHAM AND ISAAC

LISTEN

Talk about your day. Check-in to see how everyone is doing. Share blessings and challenges. This will help you connect God's word to your daily lives.

Read Genesis 22-26 at your own pace.

LEARN

Discuss what you've read. Begin with any of your own observations or questions. Discuss the questions for each chapter. Conclude with Luther's Four Questions (bottom).

Genesis 22 Why does God test Abraham/us? How has God tested you? How did God test Abraham? How does Isaac point us to Jesus? What empowered Abraham to pass the test? (cf. Hebrews 11:17-19) How does the ram in the thicket point us to Jesus? How do we get faith like Abraham to pass our tests?

Genesis 23 What did Abraham do when Sarah died? Why is the death of a believer both happy and sad? What people owned the land where Abraham was living at that time? Why is it significant that Abraham bought a piece of that land? (remember God's promises to Abraham)

Genesis 24 What kind of wife did Abraham want for Isaac? Why? How did/will you choose a spouse? What prayer did the servant pray to find Isaac's wife? T/F – that's a good way to find a spouse! To whom did God lead the servant? How did Rebekah and her family respond to the request to become Isaac's wife? T/F – you need to find the right person to have a blessed marriage.

Genesis 25 Where was Abraham buried? Why does Moses record genealogy of Abraham and Ishmael? What prophecy did the LORD give about Isaac's twin sons? Name and describe each of the twin sons. What sin do Isaac and Rebekah commit (v.28)? T/F – all parents love one child more than another. How did Jacob trick Esau? Give an example of a time you tricked someone.

Genesis 26 When a famine came, what promises did the LORD make to Isaac? How did Isaac repeat his father's sin? T/F – children are always like their parents. How did the LORD bless Isaac? What do we learn about God when he blesses us even after sinning? What quarrels did Isaac have with locals? How did the LORD reassure him? How does the LORD reassure you?

Luther's Four Questions

1. *What does this teach you about God?*
2. *What sin does this lead you to personally confess?*
3. *How does this point us to Jesus?*
4. *What does God want us to believe or do as we think about this?*

LOVE

Pray from what you learned:

Thank you, Jesus, for ...
Help me ...

Add any other prayers for self, family or others and the Lord's Prayer.
